SUBJECT:

Zoning Code Text Amendment - Noise Regulations

A hearing regarding an amendment to the Village's noise regulations was initiated at the Plan & Zoning Commission's January 2 meeting. In an effort to encourage more public participation, the Commission continued the hearing until February 4 and asked that public hearing signs be posted at the parks. Signs were posted at each park and staff has posted an update on the hearings on the Village website and via social media.

NEIGHBORING COMMUNITIES

The Commission also asked staff to research how neighboring communities are regulating noise from park and school district special events. We contacted Winnetka, Glencoe, Wilmette, Northbrook, Kenilworth, Glenview and Highland Park and read the noise regulations in each of their Village Codes.

The communities used a variety of standards to determine if a noise was a violation including: whether a 'reasonable person' would find the noise disturbing; whether the noise was 'audible' at a certain distance; and whether the noise exceeded certain decibel levels. Most had more stringent requirements for night time hours and weekends. The reasonable person and audible standards are universally enforced by police officers in the field.

Northbrook specifically exempts park district and school district special events from their decibel level limits. The village codes of the other six communities do not specifically address park or school district events. All seven communities report that they have not had complaints about these types of events and so enforcement of their noise standards hasn't been an issue. A table summarizing our findings is attached.

REVISED ORDINANCE - COLLABORATIVE DISCUSSION WITH PARK DISTRICT

Since the Commission's January meeting, the Village President, Northfield Park District President, Park District staff and Village staff discussed ideas on how to balance the Park District's ability to put on popular community events, such as the summer concert series held last summer, along with everyone's desire to establish reasonable noise guidelines. The following outlines the collaborative outcome of that discussion submitted to the Commission for its consideration:

- 1. Exempt special events held on Park District property from the noise standards of Sec. 19-3(9) (see attached draft ordinance) during the following hours:
 - Sunday from 12 p.m. -7 p.m.
 - Monday-Thursday from 10 a.m.-8:30 p.m.
 - Friday and Saturday from 10 a.m.-10 p.m.
- 2. Maintain the 'reasonable person' standard, rather than an audible standard or decibel standard, for all Park District events including athletic, non-athletic or private events.
- 3. Establish the following parameters for *private* events (*any* event not organized by the park district) that will have amplified sound:
 - Must be issued a permit by the Park District
 - Such permits will be limited to ten (10) annually
 - Permit conditions will require
 - Adherence to the hours noted above
 - Acknowledgement that Village Police Department will be the sole arbiter of whether noise levels are reasonable
 - Private event permittee may seek relief from these restrictions directly from the Village Board.
- 4. Exempted Park District sponsored events will be limited to the same number and scope as currently exist. Current Park District sponsored events include the following:
 - Eggstravaganza at Clarkson Park
 - Market & Music summer concert series at Clarkson Park
 - 4th of July at Willow Park
 - State Fair/Ribfest at Clarkson Park
 - Movies or theatre in the parks

The Village Attorney has revised the proposed text amendment to reflect this approach and the attached ordinance is being submitted to the Commission for its consideration. He has also added a definition of "Park District Special Community and Civic Events" to add clarity. The Commission should feel free to adopt as many or as few of these ideas into its final recommendation as it deems fit. There may be facets of this the Commission wishes to debate further. For example, the revised ordinance would have the Park District or one of its private permitees go directly to the Village Board for relief from these new guidelines. If the Commission wanted to require that requests for relief go through a hearing with the Commission first, or some other process, that certainly could be a part of your recommendation. Or the Commission may wish to constrict or expand the exempt hours; or increase or decrease the number of events the Park District can hold annually. The provisions in the attached ordinance are not a fait accompli.

GENERATORS

A question was raised at the January meeting about whether the regulations should address generators. The accessory structure language (Sec. 18-2) in our Zoning Code requires a 10' setback as well as some sort of screening for generators. Staff also requires generators to meet a certain sound rating when being installed. The Building Commissioner can only remember receiving one generator complaint and that was resolved. The Police Department indicates they haven't received any complaints regarding generator noise. If the Commission feels the language should explicitly exempt generators, however, we can add that to your recommendation.

COMMISSION DIRECTION

If the Commission is in agreement with the provisions of the model ordinance, it may wish to consider the following motion:

Motion to recommend to the Village Board approval of the model noise standards as presented by Village staff on February 4, 2019.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTERS 14 "NUISANCES" AND CHAPTER 15 "OFFENSES, MISCELLANEOUS" AND APPENDIX A 'ZONING ORDINANCE" OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF NORTHFIELD, ILLINOIS

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Northfield. Cook County, Illinois, acting in the exercise of their home rule powers, as follows:

SECTION 1: Paragraph (12) of Section 14-1 "Enumeration" of Article I, "In General" to Chapter 14 "Nuisances" of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Northfield, Illinois, shall be deleted in its entirety and shall be "Reserved".

SECTION 2: Section 15-20 "Offensive Noises Prohibited" of Article I, "General" to Chapter 15 "Offenses, Miscellaneous" of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Northfield, Illinois, shall be deleted in its entirety and shall be "Reserved".

SECTION 3: Section 3-2 "Terms Defined" of Article III, "Definitions" to Appendix A "Zoning Ordinance" of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Northfield, Illinois, shall be amended by adding a new definition, to be added in alphabetical order and shall be added and shall read as follows:

PARK DISTRICT SPECIAL COMMUNITY AND CIVIC EVENTS: Events sponsored by the Park District or the Park District in cooperation with another government or civic entity; the objective of which is to enhance the sense of community in the Village. Such events might include, among others, seasonal youth activities, food tasting, food preparation competitions, musical concerts, theatrical performances, markets and outdoor movies.

SECTION 4: Section 19-3 "Noise" of Article XIX, "Performance Standards and Temporary Uses" to Appendix A "Zoning Ordinance" of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Northfield, Illinois, shall be deleted in its entirety and a new Section 19-3 shall be added and shall read as follows:

Sec. 19-3: NOISE STANDARDS FOR ALL ZONING DISTRICTS

It shall be unlawful for any person within the Village to make, continue, or cause to be made or continued, any loud, unnecessary or unusual noise which unreasonably disturbs or endangers the comfort, repose, health, peace or safety of others within the Village.

The following acts are declared to be loud, disturbing and unnecessary noises in violation of this section (but this enumeration shall not be deemed to be exclusive):

- (1) The sounding of any horn or signaling device on any automobile, motorcycle or other vehicle on any street or public place of the Village, except as a danger warning.
- (2) The playing, using, operating or permitting to be played, used or operated of any radio, television, musical instrument, phonograph, loudspeaker, sound amplifier or other machine or device for the producing or reproducing of sound for the purpose of commercial advertising and which is audible upon the public streets of the Village.
- (3) The keeping of any animal shut up or tied up in any yard, enclosure, stable, house or other place within the Village which, by barking, howling, crying, singing causes frequent or long continued noise.
- (4) The discharge into the open air within the Village of the exhaust of any steam engine, gasoline engine, stationary internal combustion engine, or other kind or type of engine, motorboat or motor vehicle except through a muffler or other device which will effectively prevent loud or explosive noises.
- (5) The use within the Village of any automobile, truck, motorcycle or other vehicle, so defective or loaded in such manner or with material of such nature as to create loud or unnecessary grating, grinding, rattling or other noises.
- (6) The loading or unloading of any vehicle, or the opening or destruction of bales, boxes, crates, containers or the like, without exercising reasonable care to limit such noise and to confine the same.
- (7) Any automotive or machinery repair conducted outdoors or any construction related activity other than between the hours of seven o'clock (7:00) A.M. and seven o'clock (7:00) P.M. on weekdays, nine o'clock (9:00) A.M. and five o'clock (5:00) P.M. on Saturdays and twelve o'clock (12:00) noon and five o'clock (5:00) P.M. on Sundays. Sunday hours must be observed on all national holidays. For purposes of this subsection "outdoors" shall mean any space that is not completely enclosed with all doors and windows shut. For purposes of this subsection "construction related activity" shall mean any use of percussion or power tools, excavation, demolition, and the moving of powered construction equipment and the loading or unloading of construction material or equipment. If work outside of these hours is necessary to protect health, safety or property, an owner may apply to the Village for an emergency work permit. Emergency work permits may be issued for the minimum time necessary to complete the emergency work up to a maximum of three (3) days. The permit may be renewed for periods of up to three (3) days while the emergency continues. The person actually committing the violation, the general contractor, the permittee, the property owner and the property occupier, shall be jointly and severally liable for any violations of this subsection.

- (8) The creation within the Village of any excessive noise in the vicinity of any school, institution of learning, church, synagogue, court or hospital, while the same is in use, which unreasonably interferes with the workings of such institution, or which disturbs or unduly annoys occupants, provided conspicuous signs are displayed in the vicinity of any such building indicating that the same is a school, hospital, court, church or synagogue.
 - (9) The following circumstances shall create a presumption of a violation of this Section.
 - (a) The production or permitting of noise between the hours of seven o'clock p.m. and seven o'clock a.m. in such manner as to be plainly audible at a distance of one hundred (100') feet from the noise source.
 - (b) The generation of a level of sound as measured at the lot line of the source which is greater than the "A-weighted" sound level set forth in the table below:

District Classification of Receiving Property	Time of Bay	Maximum 'A-Weighted' Sound Level
Residential	7:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M.	65 dBA
All other land uses	7:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M.	70 dBA

The limits set forth in subparagraphs (9) (a) and (b) above shall not apply to the following: noises not under the control of the owner or occupant of the property; noises emanating from temporary construction or repair pursuant to appropriate permits; noise due to an emergency situation on the site; intermittent noise due to normal maintenance activities conducted in conformance with this section and noises from Park District and School District athletic events; other Park District and School District events that do not include sound amplification and private events on Park District property that do not include sound amplification. These limits shall, likewise, not apply to noise from the following events which do include sound amplification:

- (i) Park District sponsored special community and civic events during the following hours: Sunday from 12 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.; Monday Thursday from 10:00 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. and Friday and Saturday from 10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. Exempt, sound amplified Park District special community and civic events conducted by the Park District shall be limited to 17 per calendar year. The Park District may seek relief from the conditions of this paragraph (b) only from the Village Board.
- (ii) Private sound amplified events held on Park District property shall be subject to the following conditions:
 - (1) the Park District has issued a permit for the event;
 - (2) the hours set forth in (a) above shall be applicable;
 - (3) the permittee must acknowledge that the determination of whether noise levels are reasonable shall be within the sole discretion of the Northfield Police Department.
 - (4) No more than 10 private events with sound amplification may be held within any calendar year.

The permittee may seek relief from the conditions of this paragraph (b) only from the Village Board.

SECTION 5: That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Friends-

As some of you know, I am a Park District Trustee in Northfield. When I joined the Board of Trustees, my #1 goal was to help increase participation and engagement of

the community through events that would bring the community together in our parks. As a board and park district administration, I think we have been successful at that!

However, it turns out that there is an antiquated noise ordinance in Northfield that could be applied to pretty much any event we host-sporting events, 4th of July, RibFest, Market & Music, all AYSO, Trevian, FC United, KWBA games, etc. We learned that even the sound of children playing on the Clarkson Park playground exceeds the allowed decibel level in the noise ordinance. The school district is also impacted by this ordinance for any event held in the parks or on their playgrounds.

What's at stake?

If the ordinance isn't updated in a sensible way, a single complaint (which has been received by the Village-- yes, 1 single complaint) could essentially curtail use of the parks in our community for events that we all enjoy and that bring our community together.

What can you do?

We need members of the Northfield community to communicate their support of a sensible revision of the village zoning noise ordinance to either:

A) Exempt the Northfield Park District from the local noise ordinance, allowing the elected Park District Board of Trustees to make sensible decisions on event types and start/end times that make sense for our community.

ÖR

B) Exempt the Northfield Park District from the local noise ordinance during specific days and times to coincide with event programming and typical usage of the park facilities.

Friends and neighbors,
The Northfield Park district seeks to offer the community a wide range of programs and activities at our park properties and facilities.
We work closely with the Village and School District. These three bodies of local government maintain excellent relationships with each other, especially since we all serve largely the same people.
Sometimes issues come up that weren't necessarily predicted when the different bodie created their rules and codes. Currently, there is a question regarding the Village's noise ordinance, and how it pertains to the School District(s) and the Park District.
It came to our attention recently that many (if not most) activities at park facilities and outdoor school events technically are in violation of the village noise ordinance. For example, decibel readings show that even the sound of children playing at Clarkson Park exceeded the limits. Looking at the various sporting events, 4 th of July, Ribfest, etcetera that are held in locations across the Village, they are all technically potential violations.

We are seeking a modification to the Village Noise Ordinance so that we can continue to offer the types of activities our residence have come to enjoy. Depending upon the outcome, our ability to offer programming and events in the future may be seriously affected.
